

THE KYAMBURA DISCOVERY CENTRE

Introduction

The Kyambura Gorge Ecotourism Project has undertaken a series of activities since 2009 to safeguard the Kyambura Gorge ecosystem.

Today, Volcanoes Safaris and Volcanoes Safaris
Partnership Trust (VSPT) are the single largest
stakeholders in the Gorge ecosystem after
the Ugandan Wildlife Authority. Without the
intervention of Volcanoes Safaris and VSPT, the
survival of the gorge and chimps would be under
severe threat from increasing human population
and development.

Through the strategic assembling of land, VSPT has created a buffer zone to safeguard the Gorge. It also links Kyambura Gorge Lodge to the local community and promotes sustainable ecotourism and conservation in one of the most important areas for avian, primate and wildlife biodiversity in Africa.

The project is the first of its kind in the area and is an example of VSPT's pioneering work.
